THE ABOVE NAMED COMPLAINING WITNESS BEING DULY SWORN SAYS THAT THE ABOVE NAMED DEFENDANT(S) IN THE COUNTY OF MILWAUKEE, STATE OF WISCONSIN.

COUNT 01: POSSESSION OF CONTROLLED SUBSTANCE - COCAINE

On December 8, 2007, at 4267 South Packard Avenue, City of St. Francis, did knowingly possess cocaine, a controlled substance, contrary to Wisconsin Statutes sections 961.16(2)(b)1 and 961.41(3g)(c).

AS TO COUNT 01:

Upon conviction of this offense, defendant shall be fined not more than \$5,000 or imprisoned for not more than 1 year in the county jail.

Upon conviction of this offense, the court shall suspend the defendant's operating privilege for not less than 6 months nor more than 5 years pursuant to section 961.50(1), Stats. If the court suspends the defendant's operating privileges the court shall impose a reinstatement assessment fee of \$50.00. If the defendant's driving privileges are already revoked or suspended, any revocation imposed must be served consecutively.

I am a City of Saint Francis Police Officer. This complaint is based information and belief based on police reports prepared by City of Saint Francis Police Sergeant Kevin Hunter and City of Saint Francis Police Officer Dimitri Kamolov. These reports reveal that:

On December 8, 2007 at 4267 South Packard Avenue in the City of Saint Francis, Milwaukee County, Wisconsin, defendant Leonard Van Vlaenderen was taken into custody for operating a vehicle under the influence of a controlled substance.

A search of defendant Leonard Van Vlaenderen incident to his arrest revealed two clear plastic baggies inside defendant Leonard Van Vlaenderen's left front pants pocket. Each of the two plastic baggies contained a yellowish-white rock that City of Saint Francis Police Sergeant Kevin Hunter suspected to be cocaine base.

City of Saint Francis Police Sergeant Kevin Hunter is trained and experienced in the administration of the Nark Pouch Cocaine Salts and Base Reagent Test. The Nark Pouch Cocaine Salts and Base Reagent Test is a test to determine the presence of cocaine. Sergeant Hunter subjected a sample of the suspected cocaine base recovered from defendant Leonard Van Vlaenderen to the Nark Pouch Cocaine Salts and Base Reagent Test and

received a positive result. One of the rocks of cocaine weighed 2.2 grams. One of the rocks of cocaine weighed 2.5 grams. The total weight of the cocaine recovered from defendant Leonard Van Vlaenderen is 4.7 grams.

On December 8, 2007, Defendant Leonard Van Vlaenderen asked Sergeant Hunter what would happen next. Sergeant Hunter informed defendant Leonard Van Vlaenderen that he would be transported to the Criminal Justice Facility and would be charged with either Possession of Controlled Substance with Intent to Deliver Cocaine or Possession of Controlled Substance Cocaine. Defendant Leonard Van Vlaenderen then told Sergeant Hunter that it was not for delivery.

While conducting a medical intake report as part of the intake process of defendant Leonard Van Vlaenderen, defendant Leonard Van Vlaenderen indicated that he was under the influence of cocaine.
